# THE OUTSTANDING AGRICULTURAL EDUCATOR AWARD NOMINATION FORM

The American Association for Agricultural Education recognizes annually an individual who has made outstanding contributions over the years to agricultural education. Following is a description of the award, the selection procedures, and criteria for the selection of recipients.

#### Purpose and Selection Procedures

- 1. The purpose of the award is to recognize and encourage superior contribution in agricultural education.
- 2. The award consists of \$500 and a plaque.
- 3. Nominations may be made by an active member of the association.
- 4. Nominees must be members who have maintained reasonably continuous membership in the association.
- 5. The award will be made by the Board of Directors upon the recommendations of the three AAAE Regional Vice-Presidents.
- 6. The Secretary of the AAAE shall send applications to all members of the organization prior to the annual meeting date.
- \*7. Five copies of completed nominations are due in the designated office, at the designated time prior to the annual meeting date.
- 8. Nominations shall be limited to three\_typewritten pages. No other supporting information (letters, etc.) will be accepted.
- \*9. The Regional Vice Presidents shall forward all nominations to the selection committee, who will report back to the regional vice president for selection.

\* To expedite the process, mail your nominations to the Vice-President listed on the awards application.

#### Criteria for Selection of Recipients

The basis of the award will be: 1) excellence in teaching undergraduates, graduate students or both; 2) significant research in the field of agricultural education and related areas; 3) scholarly writing pertaining to education; and 4) service to agricultural education and and related areas.

Evidence relating to the following shall accompany each nomination.

1. Excellence in teaching -- preservice and inservice -- undergraduate, graduate, or non-credit courses or programs. Knowledge of field, methodology, and achievement.

2. Research -- personally completed or directed. (Bibliography)

3. Writings -- books, periodicals, bulletins and editorial services.

4. Service rendered -- professional, to community, to state and to the nation. (List)

Longevity will be considered, but will not necessarily be a prime factor in the selection of recipients. The award is intended to serve as an incentive for accomplishment on the part of recipients with many future years of service as well as to recognize accomplishments of those nearing retirement.

## FELLOW AND SENIOR FELLOW NOMINATIONS American Association for Agricultural Education

### PURPOSE

- Levels: Two levels of fellowship in the American Association for Agricultural Education were approved at the annual meeting of AAAE in December, 2008: Fellow and Senior Fellow.
- Fellow: The purpose of the Fellow award is to recognize those members of the association who have made exceptional contributions to the profession and who have no less than 10 years and no more than 20 years of active service at the university level and who show great promise for continued contributions.

No more than three Fellows may be elected in a calendar year.

Fellows automatically become Senior Fellows when they complete the 20<sup>th</sup> year of active service at the university level.

Senior Fellow: The purpose of the Senior Fellow award is to recognize those members of the association who have made exceptional and sustained contributions to the profession and who have more than 20 years of active service at the university level.

> No more than one Senior Fellow may be elected in a calendar year. Persons who were elected as Fellows and advance to the rank of Senior Fellows are not considered in this limit.

- NOMINATOR: Include the nominator's typewritten name, signature, mailing address (with zip code), and telephone number (with area code), email, and the date

## BASIS OF NOMINATION:

- I. Personal achievements, recognitions, and service (20 points maximum).
  - A. Degrees received. Give field, date, and institution for each degree.
  - B. Professional positions held. Give years, organizations, and locations.
  - C. Membership in honorary academic societies.
  - D. Membership in professional societies/organizations.
  - E. Honors and awards received since baccalaureate degree. (Do not include service functions in honorary organizations).
  - F. Service to AAAE
    - 1. Appointed positions
    - 2. Elected positions
    - 3. Other service to the Association
  - G. Other Service (Significant service to other societies, organizations, or agencies.)
- II. Professional achievements in agricultural education (60 points maximum) Describe achievements only in the areas listed below in which the nominee has made significant contributions. Indicate the percent of time spent in, or the percent weight you want the evaluators to assign to each area of the activities on which the nomination is based. Assigning a "0" weight to one or more of them will not weaken your nomination. Percentages should total 100.
  - A. Teaching/Extension/Industry Education (percent of time or weight \_\_\_\_\_\_.) Achievements in (1) communicating ideas clearly, (2) influencing attitudes or motivating favorable action, to a significant degree, with students or clients. Evaluate the quality and effectiveness of publications supporting the nominee's performance.
  - B. Investigative Competency (percent of time or weight \_\_\_\_\_.) Evaluate significance and originality of basic and applied research contributions and evidence of creative reasoning and skill in conducting research.

Evaluate quality and effectiveness of research publications.

- C. Service (Significant service to the profession in universities, foundations, associations, commercial organizations, communities, etc. DO NOT repeat information listed in Section I.) (percent of time or weight \_\_\_\_\_\_.) Development or improvement of significant program practices or products in agricultural education. Significance, originality, and acceptance by the public. Evaluate the quality and effectiveness of publications to support the significance of the program practices or products.
- D. Leadership (percent of time or weight \_\_\_\_\_.) Evidence of creativeness and effectiveness or administrative activities within or outside of the USA.

- III. Summary (20 points maximum)
  - A. Professional publications. On one page or less, give the total number (not the titles) of professional publications in each of the following categories: (a) books written, (b) books or other publications edited; (c) chapters of books written; (d) technical papers; (e) non-technical papers; (f) patents; (g) invited lecturers, seminars, or symposia presentations; and (h) other related oral, written, visual presentations, or products. On a second page, list only the twelve (12) most significant publications, patents, and presentations, or products in literature citation form.
  - B. Nominator's support letter. Summarize in a half page or less, the most significant personal and professional achievements which you believe qualify the nominee for election to Fellowship in the Association. Address this letter to the Fellows Awards Coordinator
  - C. Supporting letters. A maximum of three (3) supporting letters, of one page each in length, will be considered. It is important to keep letters to one page in length. Supporting letters are solicited by, and addressed to, the nominator. Attach one copy of each of the three letters to each of the eight copies of the nomination. Members of the Fellows Committee and members of the AAAE Executive committee are not eligible to write supporting letters.

The Nomination packet shall be limited to three typewritten pages. The Nominator's support letter and other supporting letters do not count against the three page limit.

## **Fellows Committee**

Members of the Fellows Committee will consist of seven members. Six members should be selected from among the prior years Fellows. The past president will chair the committee. During the first year of the program, the committee will be specified as described below.

<u>Fellows Committee</u> Current AAAE Past President, Chair Six Fellows appointed by the AAAE President Persons serving on the Fellows Committee are not eligible to prepare nominations or write letters of support.

## **Processing of Nominations**

The Fellows Committee evaluates the nominations and sends its recommended rankings to the AAAE immediate past president. The AAAE Executive Committee receives the recommendations and makes the elections on behalf of the membership. Persons elected to fellowship are informed prior to the annual meeting. Nominations will not be returned to the nominators. Each nominator is encouraged to keep a file copy of the nomination since it may be resubmitted for consideration the following year, preferably after updating.

## **Award Criteria & Nomination Instructions**

#### Purpose:

The purpose of the AAAE Distinguished Teacher Award is to recognize an individual AAAE member for outstanding accomplishments as a teacher of Agricultural Education, broadly defined, in one or more settings.

#### **Nomination and Selection Procedures**

- 1. Nominations may be made by a colleague of the nominee. Self-nominations are also acceptable.
- 2. Nominations must be submitted by E-mail to the designated award coordinator by the established deadline.
- 3. Chairs of the AAAE regional presidents will review applications and select the award recipient(s).
- 4. The AAAE Board of Directors, upon recommendation of the judges, will make the award.

#### **Criteria for Selection**

- 1. The nominee must be an active member of the AAAE who has maintained reasonably continuous membership in the association.
- 2. The nominee should have at least ten years of experience teaching in higher education settings.
- 3. The nominee must have been previously recognized with an AAAE regional teaching award.
- 4. Selection will be based on documentation of outstanding accomplishments as a teacher.
- 5. Evidence of excellence in teaching should include:
  - a. Statement of teaching philosophy written by nominee.
    - Not to exceed three typewritten (12 point, Times font) double-spaced pages.
  - b. Summary of teaching evaluations conducted by students from the past five years.
  - c. Two teaching assessments by peers.
  - d. List of teaching awards and other relevant accomplishments.
  - e. Description of teaching responsibilities including the number and nature of courses and programs presented.
  - f. Letters of support from two former students
    - May be undergraduate students, graduate students, workshop participants, etc.
    - Limited to one, single-spaced typewritten page for each letter.

#### **Nomination Materials**

Nomination packets must include and shall be limited to:

- 1. Cover sheet (see next page).
- 2. Nomination letter (limited to two, single spaced, typewritten pages).
- 3. Evidence of excellence in teaching (items a-f, listed above).

### Purpose:

The purpose of the AAAE Distinguished Research Award is to recognize an individual AAAE member for outstanding research accomplishments that have significantly impacted the knowledge base and/or professional practice in Agricultural Education broadly defined.

#### **Nomination and Selection Procedures**

- 5. Nominations may be made by a colleague of the nominee. Self-nominations are also acceptable.
- 6. Nominations must be submitted by E-mail to the designated award coordinator by the established deadline.
- 7. Chairs of the AAAE Regional Research Committees will review applications and select the award recipient(s).
- 8. The award will be made by the AAAE Board of Directors upon recommendation of the Chairs of the AAAE Regional Research Committees.

#### **Criteria for Selection**

- 6. The nominee must be an active member of the AAAE who has maintained reasonably continuous membership in the association.
- 7. Nominees should have sustained a program of research for at least ten years.
- 8. The nominee must have been previously recognized with an AAAE regional research award.
- 9. Selection will be based on documentation of outstanding research accomplishments. Documentation should include:
  - a. Candidate's statement concerning their research focus, research priorities, and actual or anticipated impact on theory and/or practice.
  - b. Proof of frequent, consistent and important contributions to the knowledge base in Agricultural Education broadly defined as documented by a list of publications and presentations.
  - c. Recognition through such things as previous research awards, invited presentations, extramural funding, service on grant panels, service as a journal editor, and service on editorial review boards as documented by a list of recognitions.
  - d. Providing leadership for major research initiatives on a regional, national, or international level as documented by the candidate's statement and/or a list of contributions.
  - e. Impact as a research mentor for graduate students, post docs, and early career faculty. This will be documented by two letters from the candidate's protégé's.

- 4. Cover sheet.
- 5. Nomination letter (limited to 2 single spaced typewritten pages).
- 6. Candidate's statement (limited to 2 single-spaced typewritten pages).
- 7. Two letters of reference from individuals who are familiar with the candidate's research abilities (such as protégés, professional colleagues, etc.) (limited to 1 single spaced typewritten page for each letter).
- 8. Lists of publications presentations, recognitions, and contributions.
