*Dr. Diane Barone, is a Professor of Literacy Studies in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction in the College of Education at the University of Nevada. Dr. Barone developed a basic qualitative research class and an advanced qualitative research class for the College of Education at the University of Nevada. She has been co-editor of the Reading Research Quarterly, the renowned research publication for literacy/reading and one of the highest regarded educational journals, since 1994. During her term of editorship she has seen the journal go from almost entirely quantitative articles to a current mix of about half quantitative and half qualitative. During her editorship she has conducted workshops to help authors improve their qualitative research and reviewers to understand and more accurately judge it. Dr. Barone served as the chair of the University of Nevada, Reno Faculty Senate in 1998-99.
