#### Notes:

- 1. The NC-AAAE Professional/Research Conference will be held in Ithaca and at Cornell. Registration includes transportation and meals as indicated in the program. Many of your students, particularly doctoral students will elect to register for the Research Conference
- 2. The NC-AAAE Student Conference will be held separately at the state FFA Camp in the Adirondack National Park. Registration includes transportation, lodging, and all on-site meals while at the Camp. This has traditionally been called the "Undergraduate" Conference, but many of the students attending it are master's students so we are referring to it as the Student Conference.
- 3. SEPARATE registration forms are provided for the Professional/Research and Student Conferences

The dates of the conference are Sunday, Sept 21 through Tuesday, Sept 23. Travis and I strongly encourage you to plan to arrive the afternoon of Saturday, Sept 20, or even earlier. This is a lovely area and we have arranged some really interesting options for tours on Sunday morning. We will also provide information for additional recreation and tours if you plan to arrive earlier than Saturday.

- 1. Air Travel. Four airports serve the immediate area. We suggest that you book flights early. The local airport is served by USAirways and Northwest.
  - Ithaca (ITH) is 2 miles from the hotel
  - Elmira/Corning (ELM), 35 miles
  - Binghamton (BMG), about 45 miles
  - Syracuse (SYR), 65 miles

### 2. Lodging

- The conference hotel is Ramada Inn, Ithaca.
- The conference rate is \$99.95 per night. We blocked a number of double/doubles as well as single kings. We have rooms blocked for Friday night through Tuesday night at that rate. The entire hotel is non-smoking. The number of rooms for Friday and Monday nights is limited.
- Call the hotel directly at 607-257-3100 to book your rooms and tell them you are with AAAE.
- DEADLINE for hotel reservations is September 1. After that the rates go up.
- 3. Transportation while at the conference
  - Shuttles from and to the airport are provided by the hotel.
  - Shuttles to and from campus will be provided.
  - Parking is available on campus by advance arrangement if needed.
  - For university groups bringing vans or busses, please let us know and we will incorporate your vehicles into our planning and provide parking tags for you to park on campus.

Students will be transported from Ithaca to Camp Oswegatchie (http://www.oswegatchie.org/) in groups as van loads are ready to leave Sunday. If students arrive before Sunday, you will need to make hotel reservations for them in Ithaca. The registration fee is higher than other years but hotel accommodations will not be needed, except for any students arriving earlier than Sunday.

Recreational options will include canoeing, kayaking, hiking, swimming, etc. Leadership events will include low ropes and high ropes courses and team building activities. Formal classes will include research interpretation and evaluation.

Camp Oswegatchie is located on a 1,200 acre property that belongs to NYSFFA in Northern New York State. The facilities are very rustic; it is a state FFA camp, not a hotel.
