Swortzel called for papers for the Mobile conference, Feb 2 – 3, 2003.

Coffey emphasized that the Tulsa conference from Feb. 5 - 9, 2004, will be a cooperative venture hosted by all Kentucky institutions.

A motion to limit the number of times one may receive each of the four major awards to one was moved by Flowers and seconded by Shinn. Discussion was amended by Weeks and seconded by Herring to align our awards selection process with AAAE including a minimum of three-years continuous membership prior to application. Motion as amended passed.

David Lawver present resolutions thanking University of Florida personnel for their efforts especially in the Professional Development sessions and for cooperating with other agencies to arrange the barbecue and field trip. Motion passed.
