Consider addressing the following in your handout/presentation:
  - 1) What was the problem that needed to be solved?
  - 2) What <u>process</u> was utilized to plan and conduct the successful event, strategy, project, etc.
  - 3) Why was the event, strategy, project successful? How did you measure success?
  - 4) What <u>advice</u> do you have for other universities that want to conduct this event, strategy, project, etc.?
